Modern molding are very simple. Clam shell casing. Small. If you want totally modern you have to have the whole interior project in mind. I think the fireplace should be stone up till the ceiling and the book cases on either side should have doors like the kitchen but there should be no base on the cabinets (hanging on the wall) with unconnected shelves above it. We could go with a more shaker casing that would look like your doors in the kitchen. The wainscoting in the dining room will be like the doors (no molding in the squares. Maybe I do another arch over by the cellar door and run a big cove mahogany crown around the family room. How do you like these run on sentences. I HAVE TO LET IT FLOW.
