Reuniting with McMullen co-stars Connie Britton (*Friday Night Lights*), and Mike McGlone, along with Noah Emmerich (*Little Children*, *Beautiful Girls*) and Kerry Bishé (*Newlyweds*, *Red State*), Burns seamlessly weaves an ensemble story of adult siblings dealing with the desire of their estranged father (Ed Lauter, *The Artist*, *The Longest Yard*) to return home for Christmas for the first time since he walked out on his family 20 years ago.
